## Principal's Corner

Here we are at the end of the first semester! At this time of the year, I like to remind students and families how important final exams are. In college, the final exam is often the only opportunity to demonstrate knowledge and earn a grade. Final exams provide the opportunity for each student to review what has been learned over the semester and demonstrate this knowledge. Learning to prepare for a final exam is also helpful, as students will face many important exams in the future. First semester final examinations will be **Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, January 24th, 25th and 26th**. Exams are two hours in length, and a schedule is enclosed on **page 19** of this newsletter.

In being properly prepared for final exams, students should get plenty of rest, eat breakfast, and start studying early. As a parent or guardian, encourage your child to plan study time according to the demands of their course load while keeping their many other important obligations in mind. Time management is a skill that will prove useful in their lives. A good thing to keep in mind during this busy time is that **the CKHS library is open on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays until 5:00 PM and Thursdays, Friday until 3:30**.

We have a few announcements and reminders. First, students must leave their cell phones turned off and in their lockers or back packs during the school day, with the exception being at lunch while in a designated eating area. The same applies to electronic devices such as headphones, IPOD/MP3 players, and hand-held electronic games. You can help us by reinforcing these rules at home. Also, help us minimize classroom interruptions by making sure your student remembers lunch money, homework, bus notes when needed, etc., and to make after-school arrangements before leaving home in the morning.

Progress Reports went home with students December **15th**. The semester ends on January 27th. Semester report cards will go home with students on February **10th**. If your student is struggling academically, please do not hesitate to contact his/her counselor or individual teachers to arrange for additional help, or simply know **this is a good time to get on your Parent Access account and review current grades with your sons or daughters**. If you do not have a Parent Access account, please call the main office at 662-2400, and someone can gladly help you with getting your account. If tutoring help is something that is needed, tutors can be arranged by calling Diane Clouser, our Tutor Coordinator @ 662-2422.

As a continuing reminder, safety in our parking lots remains a priority during the dark winter months. Please use **extreme** caution when dropping off or picking up your students, especially when it is dark and/or icy.

The **Cougar Communicator** provides you with a wealth of good information for you and your student. This edition is particularly important as we get headed toward the spring months, if your son or daughter is a senior and will be helpful to you as well. # CKHS Celebrates Our Students of The Month






## AP SCHOLARS NAMED

The 2010-2011 AP Program at Central Kitsap High School administered 1218 exams covering 25 content areas. Approximately 495 students sat for AP Exams last May. While this accomplishment is recognized by the College Board with respect to Advanced Placement, we know that it is the hard work, culture, and Dedication to Excellence of **all staff members** that make this distinction possible.

Of the approximately 495 students who tested, **189 of them have received recognition** for academic excellence on their exams.

The College Board also recognizes several levels of achievement based on students' performances on AP Exams.

Through more than 30 different college-level courses and exams, AP provides motivated and academically prepared students with the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced placement and stand out in the college admissions process. Each exam is developed by a committee of college and university faculty and AP teachers, ensuring that AP exams are aligned with the same high standards expected by college faculty at some of the nation's leading liberal arts and research institutions. More than 3,600 colleges and universities annually receive AP grades. Over 90 percent of four-year colleges in the United States provide credit and/or placement for qualifying exam grades. Research consistently shows that AP students who score a 3 or higher on AP Exams (based on a scale from 1 to 5, with 5 being the highest) typically experience greater academic success in college and higher graduation rates than students who do not participate in AP.

## Advanced Placement Testing Information

AP Testing will occur from May 7th to May 18th. Please refer to the schedule below for specific tests and times.

**The cost per test is \$87.00. Students who take Government and/or Physics C should be aware that the College Board charges a fee for each Government exam and for each section of the Physics C exam . If a student takes both Government exams, the charge will be \$174.00. The same is true for Physics C if a student takes both Mechanics and the Electricity/Magnetism sections.**

**Students who qualify for free or reduced lunch status are eligible for a reduced test fee of \$5.00 per test.**

# HSPE TESTING

Central Kitsap High Sophomores will take the **2012 High School Proficiency Exam (HSPE)** in two sessions this year. **March 13-15** we will be testing **Reading and Writing**. **The HSPE Math and Science tests have been replaced with Math and Science End of Course Exams, which will take place the last week in May.** The HSPE is a statewide exam given to all 10th graders in Washington. The test measures learning in the areas of reading, writing, math, and science. CKHS has consistently scored above the district and state averages. Our staff is committed to ongoing academic preparation, including specific HSPE test preparation. The results of this test are intended to measure what students are learning and to help teachers improve instruction by providing better information about academic areas where their students may need help. You can help your student now by talking with him/her about his/her daily work, homework and how he/she is doing on classroom tests. Challenge your student to have an "Attitude of Excellence" by putting forth his/her personal best effort and serious personal application. It is essential that students attend each session of the test. Students who miss a session of HSPE will need to retest at the next opportunity, which will be August 2012 (reading/writing), or January 2013 (math), or March/April 2013. As always, we will continue to work in partnership with you and your students as we move forward toward our goal of increasing student achievement and creating thoughtful, competent citizens for the 21st Century.

## Changes made by state Legislature:

The state has changed the Math test from the HSPE to end of course exams. End of course exams are written for Algebra 1 and Geometry. Students who are not currently enrolled in either of these courses who still need to pass the state graduation requirement for math will take the End of Course Make-Up Exam 1 and/or 2.

You may have read that the State Legislature enacted a temporary change in the math WASL graduation requirement. The change is described below:

Students in the classes of 2012 who have not passed the high school math WASL will be eligible to earn a diploma as long as they earn 2 credits of math after their sophomore year of high school. Students will be required to sit for the math HSPE, end of course exams, or use one of the Certificate of Academic Achievement (CAA) options.

If your Senior student has not passed the Math portion of the WASL exam and is currently enrolled in a math class, it is important that they earn the credit by passing the course. **They are encouraged to take the spring 2012 HSPE End of Course Math assessment, along with any other HSPE assessments that have not been passed.**

**Students who are in the class of 2013 and 2014 must pass one (1) of the two mathematics end of course exams, and students who are in the class of 2015 are required to pass both mathematics exams and the science exam.**

## **HSPE Registration Info**

**10th Graders** do not need to register - they are automatically registered for the Spring HSPE.

**Juniors and Seniors** who have not passed one or more sections of the HSPE (reading, writing or math EOC) will be automatically registered to participate in the spring HSPE. Juniors and Seniors who are scheduled to test will receive a note at school confirming their registration.

## **HSPE Study Opportunities**

CKHS has numerous tutoring/study opportunities available to our students, and our library is open every morning at 7:00 AM and remains open until 5:00 PM Monday through Wednesday and until 3:30 Thursday and Friday.

## **High school transcripts**

Students can earn a CAA (Certificate of Academic Achievement) by passing the three required assessments of the WASL/HSPE. Those areas are Reading, Writing, and Math. The transcript will indicate they passed all three required levels and have earned a CAA.

**College financial aid deadlines are approaching fast!** To be eligible for government aid, it is imperative that the FAFSA form be mailed to the processor before each college's deadline. Seniors may check in the Counseling Center for college deadline dates.

## KNOWING OTHER LANGUAGES BRINGS OPPORTUNITIES

Many students and parents know that two or three years of high school credit for studying a language other than English is required for acceptance at most four year colleges and universities, but many are unaware of the benefits of studying and knowing another language. According to the Association of Departments of Foreign Languages (ADFL), all students should also consider studying a new language because of the following opportunities that it offers:

- 1. Students gain a competitive edge.** Research has shown that math and verbal SAT scores climb higher with each additional year of foreign language study; that studying a foreign language strengthens analytic and interpretive capacities; and that three or more years of language study or more is highly regarded by college and university acceptance boards.
- 2. Workers acquire a job advantage in a global economy.** As more and more businesses work closely with companies in other countries and/or work with the large number of Americans who speak languages other than English, knowing more than one language enhances opportunities in career fields such as business, medicine and health care, teaching, communications, social services, technology, industry, the military, government and marketing.
- 3. Students learn about other cultures.** Studying a new language provides the opportunity to learn about and make connections with people of a different culture, plus gain a new perspective on one's own culture. This enables students to communicate more effectively with the diverse people in their communities and beyond.

Students are encouraged to discover the variety of languages offered at Central Kitsap High School and choose to study the one that appeals to them most. ## High School & Beyond Requirements, Deadlines

As part of the state and district graduation requirements, all seniors must complete, and submit for approval, the documentation included in the High School & Beyond Portfolio. These documents include the senior's **Career Search, Personal Education Plan, Resume, Cover Letter, a Personal Statement, and at least two examples of their Best Works**. Students are also encouraged to include letter(s) of recommendation, and awards/certificates.

**Seniors currently enrolled in a Senior Social Studies Class or Career Choices should have all documents submitted, approved and uploaded to the WOIS Portfolio Website by January 13<sup>th</sup>**. Seniors enrolled in Semester 2 Senior Social Studies will need to complete these requirements by May 25<sup>th</sup>. Seniors enrolled AP Government, and AP Psychology are encouraged to complete these requirements **before AP testing**, but if they do not, they must complete these requirements by May 25<sup>th</sup>.

## Heads Up—Registration for 2012 - 2013

In March students will receive course catalogs and instructions on how to complete the course registration form. Counselors will begin registration activities by providing information to underclassmen. This information is designed to help students make wise choices for their future.

Sophomores and juniors will receive updated credit checks so they may see how they are progressing toward graduation. ## Whooping Cough (Pertussis) and Tdap Vaccinations for High School Students

Pertussis, otherwise known as “Whooping Cough”, is an acute illness with an infectious cough. There continues to be cases of Pertussis in the United States despite routine childhood vaccinations for the past 50 years. There have been recent cases of Pertussis identified in Kitsap County as well as other communities in our state. The primary reason for the continued presence of Pertussis in our communities is that immunity to Pertussis lessens within 5 to 10 years after completion of childhood vaccinations, leaving teenagers and adults susceptible to the disease.

### What is Tdap?

**Tdap** is a vaccine formulated for teens and adults to protect against tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis (Whooping Cough)

### Who should get Tdap?

- Children ages 11 and 12
- Teens and adults up to age 65 (replace 1 tetanus booster with 1 dose of Tdap)
- Adults who care for or have contact with infants

Washington State Department of Health **requires** all 10<sup>th</sup> grade students to have the tdap vaccine if it has been 5 years since their last tetanus booster. Your School Health Consultants strongly encourage ALL high school students to get a Tdap, and consider getting one for yourself if you have not already had a dose.

## Help for Migrating Salmon

Members of the CKHS Environmental Club and Mr. Wilson’s A.P. Environmental Science class constructed a sandbag fish ladder on Strawberry Creek last Thursday, October 6<sup>th</sup>. The ladder will help salmon pass through a culvert that runs under Silverdale Loop Road. In past years, salmon had to negotiate a 3 foot vertical jump to make it through the culvert. Most migrating chum salmon were not able to make the jump so they would congregate in the pool beneath the culvert and die before spawning.

Three years ago, students from CKHS noticed the problem and installed a ladder to help. Each year since, students have installed a salmon ladder before the fall chum salmon run. The ladder must be removed in the spring of each year to prevent blocking the downstream migration of baby salmon. In two years the county will install a new culvert beneath Silverdale Loop Road thus solving the blockage problem. CKHS students will continue to install the ladder each year until the old culvert is replaced. Special thanks go out to CKHS PTSA members and parents Frank and Pam Warner who donated the pea gravel used to fill the sandbags. Thanks also go out to

CKHSPTSA member and parent Angie Henderson, for her help with student supervision and sandbag filling. And thanks go out to Josh Skulkind of the Hazelwood Family YMCA for his help driving the truck which carried the sandbags down to the stream.



## FACTS ABOUT MARIJUANA

### Use and Addiction

- The percentage of youth (aged 12 to 17) who use marijuana increased from 6.7% in 2007 to 7.4% in 2010.
- The highest percentage of past-month users among youth occurs in states with medical marijuana laws – Washington State ranks 15<sup>th</sup> nationally for the percentage of users and 44<sup>th</sup> nationally for youth who perceive that smoking marijuana is harmful.

### Youth

- Nine percent of Washington State 8<sup>th</sup> graders, 20% of 10<sup>th</sup> graders and 26% of 12 graders report current marijuana use.
- Youth who initiate marijuana use by age 13 usually do not go to college.
- Marijuana dependence accounted for 62% of the youth admissions to Washington State treatment programs.

### Health

- Harvard University researchers report that the risk of heart attack is five times higher than usual in the hour after smoking marijuana.
- The National Institute of Health found that a person who smokes five joints per week may be taking in as much tar and cancer-causing chemicals into their lungs as someone who smokes a package of cigarettes every day.
- The National Institute on Drug Abuse found that critical skills related to attention, memory and learning are significantly impaired among marijuana users, even after they had not used the drug for at least 24 hours.

### Impaired Driving

- The number of Washington State drivers found to be impaired by marijuana use increased from 1,864 in 2008 to 2,387 in 2010.
- Drivers who test positive for marijuana or self-report marijuana use are **more than twice** as likely as other drivers to be involved in motor vehicle crashes.

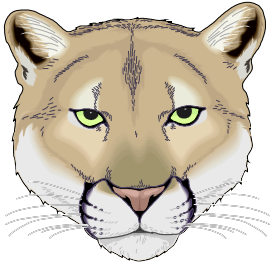
