COMMENDED STUDENTS IN THE 2009 NATIONAL MERIT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Steve Coons of Central Kitsap High School announced today that Margaret Humm, Rachel Kipps, Bernice Klise, Charles McDonald, Amanda Munsch, Julia Swanson, Micaela Tolliver and Erin Williams, have been named Commended Students in the 2012 National Merit Scholarship Program. A Letter of Commendation from the school and National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC), which conducts the program, will be presented by the principal to these scholastically talented seniors.

About 34,000 Commended Students throughout the nation are being recognized for their exceptional academic promise. Although they will not continue in the 2012 competition for national Merit Scholarships, Commended Students placed among the top five percent of more than 1.4 million students who entered the 2012 competition by taking the 2010 Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT).

“Recognition of academically talented students and the key role played by schools in their development is essential to the pursuit of educational excellence in our nation,” commented a spokesperson for NMSC. “The young people named Commended Students have demonstrated outstanding academic potential by their strong performance in this highly competitive program. We hope that this recognition will enhance their educational opportunities and that they will continue to diligently pursue their professional goals.”

Semifinalists Named in the 2012 National Merit® Scholarship Program

Officials of National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC) announced the names of approximately 16,000 Semifinalists in the 55th annual National Merit Scholarship Program. These academically talented high school seniors have an opportunity to continue in the competition for some 8,200 National Merit Scholarships, worth more than \$36 million, that will be offered next spring. To be considered for a Merit Scholarship® award, Semifinalists must fulfill several requirements to advance to the Finalist level of the competition. About 90 percent of the Semifinalists are expected to attain Finalist standing, and approximately half of the Finalists will win a National Merit Scholarship, earning the Merit Scholar® title. NMSC, a not-for-profit organization that operates without government assistance, was established in 1955 specifically to conduct the annual National Merit Scholarship Program. Scholarships are underwritten by NMSC with its own funds and by approximately 500 business organizations and higher education institutions that share NMSC's goals of honoring the nation's scholastic champions and encouraging the pursuit of academic excellence.

To become a Finalist, a Semifinalist must have an outstanding academic record throughout high school, be endorsed and recommended by the high school principal, and earn SAT scores that confirm the student's earlier performance on the qualifying test. The Semifinalist and a high school official must submit a detailed scholarship application, which includes the student's essay and information about the Semifinalist's participation and leadership in school and community activities.

Over 14,000 Semifinalists are expected to advance to the Finalist level and it is from this group that all National Merit Scholarship winners will be chosen. Merit Scholar designees are selected on the basis of their skills, accomplishments, and potential for success in rigorous college studies, without regard to gender, race, ethnic origin, or religious preference.

Impact Aid Survey - November 1st

Every year the District must apply for Federal Impact Aid funds from the U.S. Department of Education. These funds compensate CKSD for the loss of local tax dollars from tax-exempt federal property in the Silverdale and Bremerton area. The District must conduct a Federal Residence and Employment Survey on a yearly basis in order to obtain a current count of families in the District who live and/or work on federal property. On **November 1, 2011**, students will be bringing home the survey form used for this count. **It is important that all appropriate sections on the form be filled out completely and accurately and the form is signed and dated for each student.** These funds benefit all of our students and are used for basic education programs District-wide (except for the special education portion, which is used directly for that program). Federal Impact Aid is different than Heavy Impact funds. **The Federal Impact Aid survey forms are required for full funding of Impact Aid.** Your cooperation in assisting the District in this matter is greatly appreciated.

ASVAB Test – Wednesday, November 2, 2011

(Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery Test)

7:50-11:15 am – CKHS Theater

The ASVAB is a national multi-aptitude test battery that has been provided to high schools and postsecondary schools since 1968. It includes eight individual tests covering general science, arithmetic reasoning, word knowledge, paragraph comprehension, math knowledge, electronics information, auto & shop information and mechanical comprehension. It also provides three Career Exploration Scores for Verbal Skills, Math Skills, and Science and Technical Skills. These three scores serve as one of several pieces of information that can aid students in the exploration of a wide variety of educational and career options. This test is offered at no cost to high school students and there is no military obligation.

Earn Work Based Learning Credit

Consequences for Violation of Cell Phone Policy

before and after school and
during the student's lunch period
in designated eating areas
 - * Electronic devices **MAY NOT** be used in:
classrooms
hallways
locker rooms
library
 - * This applies (but is not limited) to:
cell phones
music players (iPods, etc.)
hands-free devices (Bluetooth, etc.)
- 1st Incident—Conference with administrator (device released by office staff)
 - 2nd Incident—Detention (device released by office staff)
 - 3rd Incident—ISS with phone call home indicating next infraction requires parent pick-up of device (device released by office staff).
 - 4th Incident—Thursday school with phone call home requiring parent pickup. Admin schedules conference with student and parent. Discussion includes agreement that next and subsequent infractions include OSS and parent pickup (device secured by Admin and released to parent).
 - 5th and subsequent infractions—OSS and parent pickup (device secured by admin and released to parent).

Central Kitsap High School Student Dress Code

Student dress should be appropriate for school. Dress and appearance must not present health or safety problems, cause disruption, or create a risk of disruption at school or school-sponsored activities. Students whose dress may cause distraction to the educational environment will be asked to change or go home.

Sun glasses are not allowed during the school day.

Students may not wear clothing and/or accessories that:

Advocate or convey alcohol or drug usage messages

Promote violence or illegal activity

Demean or degrade individuals or a group of people

Exhibit sexual innuendoes, blatant sexual messages, vulgarity, profanity or other inappropriate language

Is determined by local law enforcement to be affiliated with gangs, including bandanas and other paraphernalia

Undergarments (and clothing worn as undergarments) must be covered by outerwear.

“See-through” material is not appropriate for school.

Tube tops, halter-tops and swimwear are not appropriate for school

Shirts must meet the following criteria:

The stomach, lower, mid-back and sides are covered

Undergarments are not showing

Tank tops must have both shoulder straps

Tank top does not have “spaghetti straps”

Students referred to the office for dress issues will be asked to change into appropriate clothing or cover the offensive clothing or message. Students who refuse to comply will be sent home. A repeated offense of this policy may result in a parent/student meeting and/or disciplinary action in accordance with school policy and procedures.

Flu

Influenza (also called flu) is a contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza viruses. The CDC (Center for Disease Control) is recommending that everyone > 6 months old be vaccinated against influenza. Getting the vaccine now will protect you throughout the entire flu season which lasts into the spring months.

The 2010-11 influenza vaccine protects you from seasonal flu as well as H1N1. This vaccine is safe, one cannot get influenza from it, and it is available now at many drugstores and at your physician's office. (If you are allergic to eggs or are presently ill, consult your physician before getting the vaccine.)

According to the CDC, receiving the vaccine is the best way to avoid getting the flu. In addition, taking the following preventive actions will also help stop the spread of the disease.

- Cover your nose and mouth with your sleeve or a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Dispose of the tissue properly.
- Wash your hands frequently with soap and water. If not available, use hand sanitizers
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth. Germs spread easily this way.
- Try to avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- If you are sick with flu-like illness, stay home until your fever has been gone for 24 hours, and avoid contact with others.
- Practice other good health habits – get plenty of rest, eat nutritiously, stay active, and manage your stress.

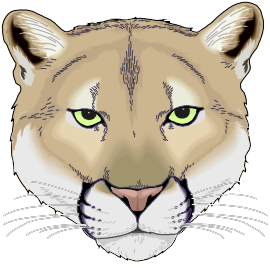
